**ABSTRACT**

The utmost consideration of this study is to investigate and compare the duties of director's in the instances where they fall short to perform their duties with a great deal of skill, care and good faith, with an emphasis towards the Sri Lankan Companies Act. Following the identification of applicable provisions of the Sri Lankan Companies Act relating to the duties of directors', there will be a thorough exploration and an assessment on Sri Lankan legislation, including a comparative analysis of equivalent provisions relating to the duties of directors' in the United Kingdom and Australia, as well as case law in both Jurisdictions using theoretical research methods supported by practical examples.
